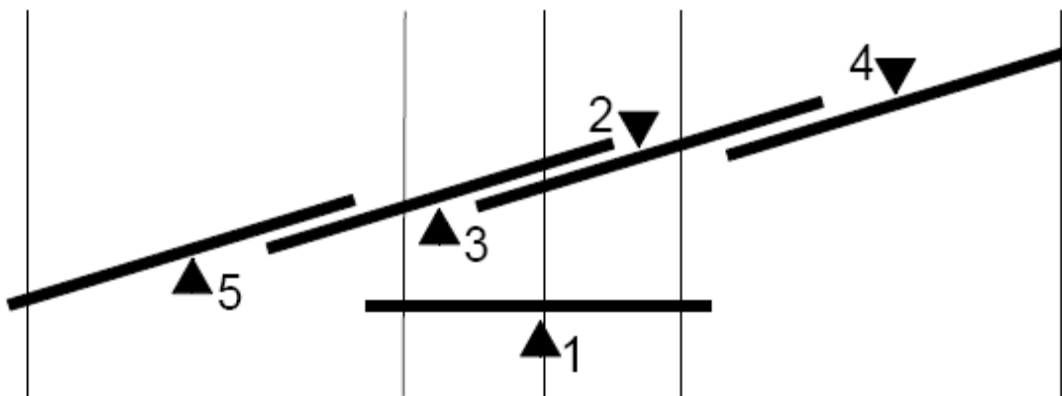


Scraping Ice Using the Ice King

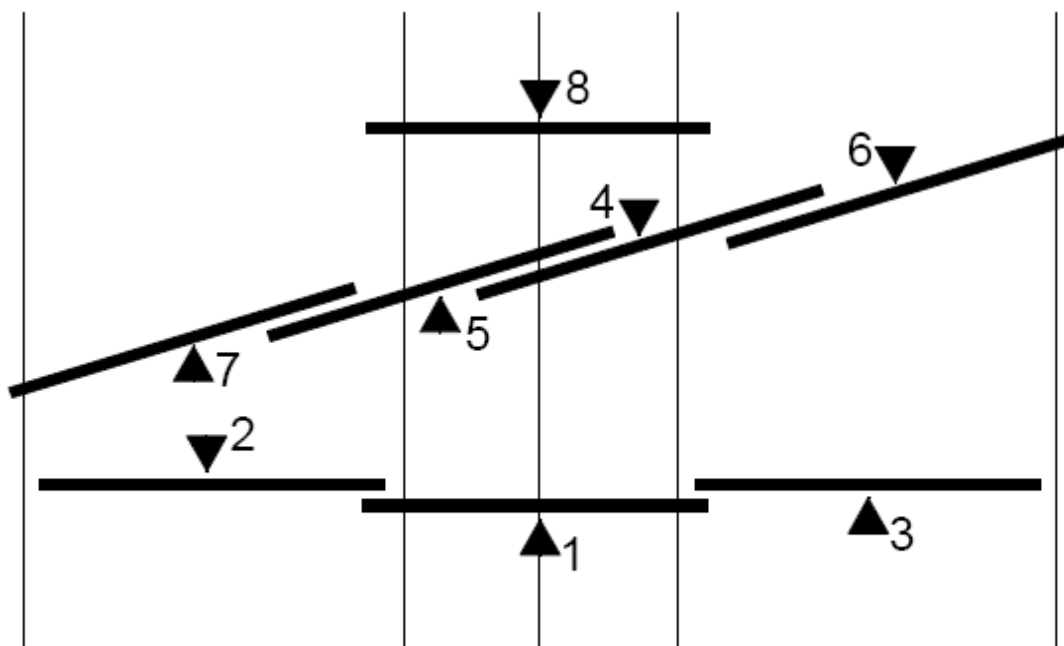
- 1) First thing you must do is unplug the Ice King from the wall plug and pull down the main handle and lock it in place with the screw lock at bottom of handle where it attaches to main unit.
- 2) Back the ice king slowly onto the ice over the boards by pushing down on the handle to keep the blade in the air. Place the blade on the ice surface to cool the blade down by placing it on one of the matts and leave it for 15 minutes to cool down.
- 3) Once blade is cool take ice king over to sheet 1 by keeping blade in the air and rolling over boards.
- 4) The first pass will always be a straight pass from the scoreboard end with the blade right in front of the hacks.
- 5) Scrape about 4 feet then check to make sure blade is scraping evenly across the blade. (Blade angle may need to be adjusted to get proper amount of cutting)
- 6) Once setup is good proceed with cutting by using the preferred cutting pattern and direction. (Clockwise or counterclockwise) Try to leave snow scraping at scoreboard end and once a sheet is complete try to clean sheet and remove snow as soon as possible.

7) We will try to keep track of the cutting patterns used on a sheet so we know what next to use and to see what seems to be working right.

8) Here are a couple common patterns we will be using here:



A five-pass three-hole pattern, here clockwise



The eight-pass game/flat pattern, here starting anti-clockwise

NOTE: For the most part with these 2 patterns we will be using the blade angled in so the snow would be pushed towards the centre of the sheet not towards the boards.
